

MORE ON THE NEW CAN-SPAM LAW...

Recall last month's Inkspot paragraph on the Can-Spam Law... effective January 1, 2004, new legislation has been put into place that limits the ability of email promotion and marketing. The CWEA office staff developed language with our attorneys to determine guidelines that can be used by the Local Sections, Committees, and CWEA. You'll still receive notices for dinner meetings and seminars, but there will be language at the bottom that allows you to "opt out" of receiving the notices. Use it, if you don't want to continue to receive email notices of our Section's events.
