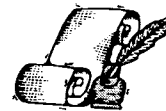

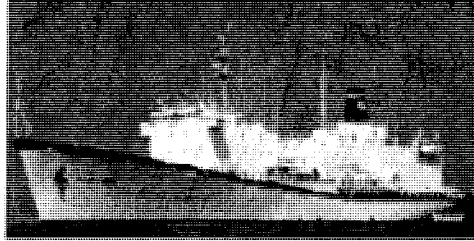

We have a great tour being led by Captain John Keever, of the Golden Bear. The dinner presentation will be by a RWQCB staff member on the subject of Total Residual Chlorine and Chlorine Produced Oxidants Policies.

Cal Maritime provides a specialized education for the maritime and transportation industries. International travel, training, and experiences-including a two-month international training cruise onboard the Training Ship GOLDEN BEAR-prepare students in fields that are increasingly global in nature.

Built for the U.S. Navy as a Hydrographic Survey Vessel to map the deep ocean floor, she was the largest and fastest oceanographic ship ever at the time she was built.

Mar 1989	delivered and placed in service as USNS MAURY (T-AGS-39).
Sep 1994	out of service
Oct 1994	struck from Navy roles and transferred to MARAD (with an agreement signed to transfer her to the California Maritime Academy in the future)
May 1996	transferred to Cal Maritime

T.S.G.B. is the fourth and largest training ship at California Maritime Academy and the third to carry the name GOLDEN BEAR. She is sometimes nicknamed "Square Bear" because of her unique profile.

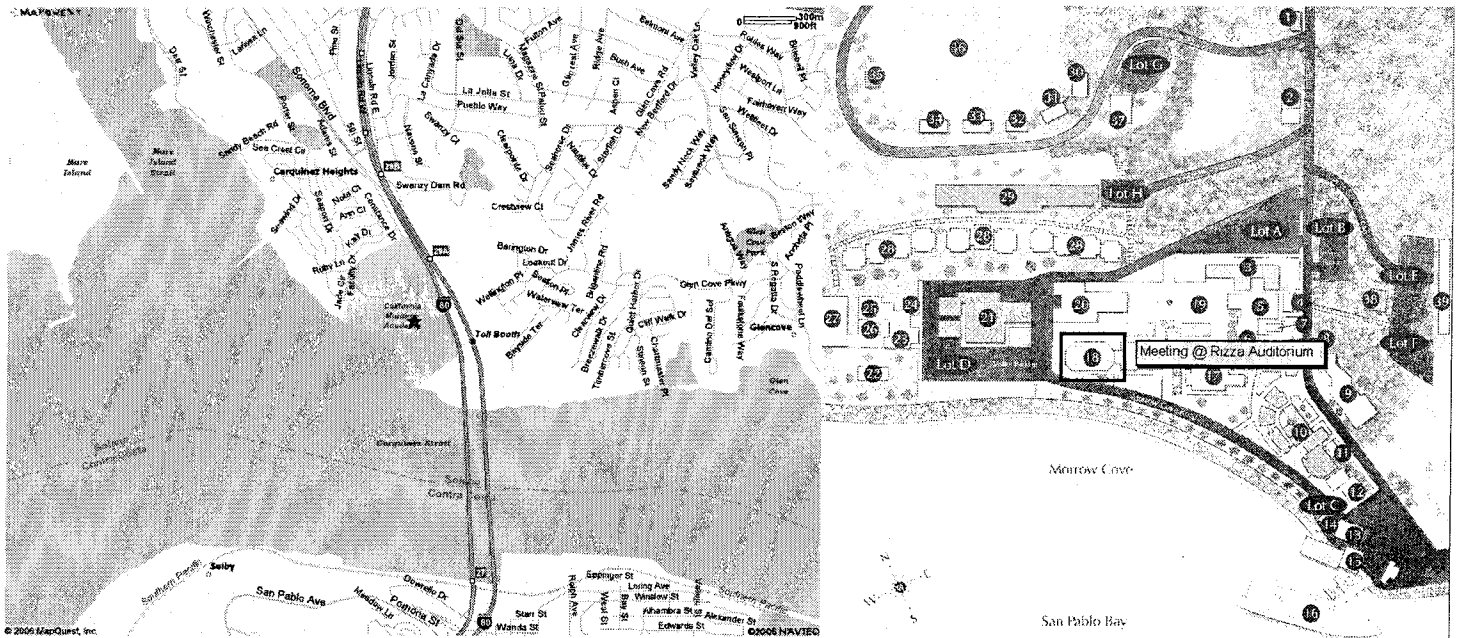
- \* East on highway 37

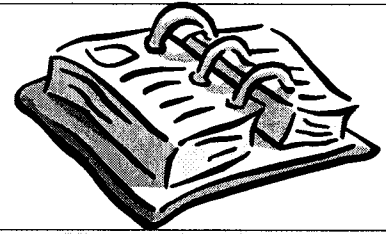
