Hurricane Katrina, which struck the U.S. Gulf states in late August, 2005, devastated wastewater utilities that provide essential services to residential and commercial interests. The long-term effect on these utilities is of great concern to local, state, and U.S. officials. This presentation will describe the Water Environment Federation study which documented damage caused by Hurricane Katrina to wastewater facilities in the Gulf region and made recommendations for governments and utilities to help recovery from this hurricane and suggestions to help mitigate damage from future natural and man-made disasters.


Online maps: Use 2901 Oak Road, Walnut Creek, CA 94597.
