Overview: The City of Hayward Water Pollution Control Facility (WPCF) is a class IV plant that provides secondary treatment to flows from Hayward. The plant treats an average dry weather daily flow of 11.9 million gallons (MG), with peak daily flows of about 16.8 MGD and peak Wet Weather flows of about 18.2 MGD. In November 2005 a \$60M plant improvement project was started. All processes were shown to meet design. The project is funded by the State Revolving Fund (SRF) that the City of Hayward secured with the State Water Resources Control Board. The project was completed in June 2008 and a one year treatment process performance evaluation was successfully conducted and submitted in October 2009 to the SWRCB.

<u>Dioxin/Furan Testing: Regulatory Requirements & Managing The Subcontract Laboratory</u> Brad Silverbush-Frontier Analytical Laboratory

Dioxin/Furan testing is a complicated methodology which requires special training when establishing requirements with a subcontract laboratory and receiving compliance laboratory reports. Interpreting subcontract laboratory reports can be very difficult. Dioxin/Furan laboratory report review requires additional understanding of terminology not customary for typical environmental testing. The first hour of this meeting will discuss the requirements under the recent Regional Order R2-2010-0054 and how it affects your facility. The speaker will discuss all aspects of proper sample collection and the updated requirements that need to be communicated to the laboratory for usable compliance data. An example laboratory report will be presented to guide the attendees on the terminology and its meaning for assessing data.

Laboratory Reports: Data Review and Assessment Strategies Diane Lawver—Quality Assurance Solutions

The second hour of this program will focus on documenting data review and assessment. The data review and assessment process can be complicated by subcontract laboratory terminology that is not aligned with the EPA's promulgated procedure or local regulatory requirements (e.g. Attachment G, March 2010). The purpose of this presentation is to simplify terminology associated with Dioxin/Furan laboratory reports, provide tools and techniques for effective Dioxin/Furan laboratory report review against permit requirements, and discuss what a POTW can communicate to its subcontract laboratory regarding formats and reporting. A user-friendly checklist with guidance language will be provided to support the attendee through the data review and assessment process. How to handle qualified data will also be covered.
